Centre for IPR Studies organized 1st Students' Seminar on 'Intellectual Property Rights and Patents: An Introduction' on 10th November 2017 from 2 to 4 PM in Seminar Hall (A-206), Galgotias University and was indeed a success in its own right. It focused on introducing IPR to the audience and consisted of three sessions following a Questions and Answers round (Q&A).
